

Living with asthma: a child's perspective

Engagement through Art workshops for children from Arabic speaking backgrounds in Western and South-Western Sydney



Project rationale

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Innovation

The project team believe it is important to value and empower children to have a voice about their experiences of asthma and to use what children tell us to inform the design of child focused solutions and practices.

Findings

Children experience asthma differently depending on the severity of their illness however they shared with us some common ideas and feelings about asthma...


- Family and friends are very important in helping children manage their asthma
- Puffers and medication help children feel better when they have an asthma attack or to enable them to participate in physical activity
- Asthma negatively impacts children by reducing their ability to engage fully in physical activities including sport
- Children experience a range of asthma symptoms that are distressing including difficulty breathing, wheezing, sneezing, chest pain and tiredness and lethargy

Findings

They also told us....

- Children would like their friends to know more about asthma so they could help them in the event of an asthma attack
- Some children expressed feelings of isolation and bullying because of their asthma
- They were left out of some games
- Some children didn't participate because they were fearful of having an asthma attack
- Some children said that many of the children in their families also had asthma

What helps with your asthma?



'I drew a puffer human as I use my puffer when I need it. I wanted to feel what it would be like to be a puffer because my puffer makes me feel calm and at peace.'

'This is a self-portrait of me holding my puffer. Taking my puffer makes me feel better.'

'I did a self-portrait of me using my puffer. Even though I don't like taking my puffer, I need it and it helps me with my asthma.'

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
'I made a diagram/ information report showing the different types of medications that help with asthma.'

'I did a painting on canvas using gold foil and paint pens. The large item is the nebuliser attached to the tubes and wires. Underneath is the puffer and the mask used with the nebuliser.'

'I made a sculpture with fabric, clay, buttons, and glue showing one person running in nature with his puffer on the side in case he needs it.'

What don't you like about having asthma?



'I drew a picture of a dragon with short breath. A dragon usually has a strong fiery breath. It shows what it feels like to have short breath, like when I run.'

Grade 6: Granville




'I painted two girls playing and one girl with asthma is not playing. It represents people not being able to play as much because of their asthma.'

'I made a painting and drawing on canvas. It shows me running a race and then I faint. I am gasping and yelling for help. Then when I take my puffer, I feel better.'

'I made a mixed media piece using textiles, paint, glue, gold foil and a selfie photo. It represents the inside of my body when I can't breathe. The gold represents the heavy weight in my body when I cough and can't breathe.'

Grade 4: Liverpool West




'I did a drawing and painting on canvas showing the inside of the body. The middle grey square represents low battery and that is how I feel when I have asthma.'

'This is a sculpture with the top of the bottle showing where the air comes into my body, the UFO shaped plastic represents my asthma blocking the air and making it harder for me to breathe with the bottle caps showing the area that leads to my lungs.'

'I did a drawing showing how I feel about my asthma when I play sports.'

'I did a painting. I used white paint on cardboard showing the germs when I sneeze.'
