- 2 Simply tear off the card and fill it in
- 3 Put it in your wallet and keep it with you at all times
- 4 Inform others about the card so they can help you in an asthma emergency

If I have my blue/grey reliever medication – please help me with Asthma First Aid

Asthma First Aid

1 Sit the person upright

- Be calm and reassuring
- Do not leave them alone

2 Give 4 separate puffs of blue/grey reliever puffer

- Shake puffer
 - Put 1 puff into spacer
 - Take 4 breaths from spacer
 - Repeat until 4 puffs have been taken
- Remember: **Shake, 1 puff, 4 breaths**

OR give 2 separate doses of a Bricanyl inhaler (age 6 & over) or a Symbicort inhaler (over 12).

3 Wait 4 minutes

- If there is no improvement, give **4 more** separate puffs of blue/grey reliever as above

OR give 1 more dose of Bricanyl or Symbicort inhaler.

4 If there is still no improvement call emergency assistance Dial Triple Zero (000)

- Say 'ambulance' and that someone is having an asthma attack
 - Keep giving **4 separate puffs every 4 minutes** until emergency assistance arrives
- OR give 1 dose of a Bricanyl or Symbicort every 4 minutes - up to 3 more doses of Symbicort
