Spacers

Why use a spacer with my puffer?

- —It is easier for many people to use.
- —More medication is inhaled into the lungs.
- —Fewer side effects from the medication.
- —For children, it is important to always use a spacer with reliever and preventer puffers.
- —For adults and adolescents, it is recommended to always use a spacer with preventer puffers. A reliever puffer can be used with or without a spacer. If you use your reliever puffer without a spacer, ask your doctor to check that you are using your puffer correctly.

Which spacer should I use?

- —Small spacers are useful for children and can be used by everyone (including adults).
- —Most children under 4 years will need a mask with their spacer.
- Choosing a spacer depends on medication type, your personal preference, budget and advice from your doctor, pharmacist or local Asthma Foundation.
